**Subject:** Report & Prayer Requests.

Dear Saint

As we are closing down the Herald office in Cape Town for this year, we would like to thank each and everybody who had contributed to a good 2002. In various ways, this year had been a year of new initiatives.

We had seen:

- **the largest single PILTC course up to date: More than 200 people attending at Paarl.**

This had been an amazing course. Even during the SECOND round of the course held in Paarl, yet another 50 individuals registered!

- **The number of PILTC students since September 2000 reaching the 1000 mark.**

We are humbled by God's grace concerning this figure. At the point of starting, we hadn't expected the PILTC to run for more than one round of 6 months. And we had just seen the completion of round nr. 12!

- **The start of special prayer camps for intercessors.**

Until this date 2 camps had been held: One at Noordhoek, and one at Franschoek. The aim is to facilitate an opportunity for intercessors to hear the voice of the Lord corporately. Feedback from both camps had been overwhelmingly positive.

- **Various prayer initiatives across the Western Cape.**

The most important of these being the Jericho Walls International initiative concerning eviction orders to territorial spirits, which had been done alongside an international team of intercessors, as well as "Operation Two-faced" which was concerned with an imprint of the face of the Roman god Janus on the street plan of the inner city of Cape Town.

- **The release of "Freemasonry: What you *DESPERATELY* need to know" on CD and video.**

Although this had not officially been done under the Herald banner, it had been a huge enterprise for a small budget such as ours, and had taken up a large chunk of the year. And we had been on a sharp learning curve concerning Christian media! What we had learnt, however, will hopefully enable us to release the next CD's and videos in this series much quicker, and of better quality.

- **The arrival of Brenda Mostert in our office as secretary and administrative assistant.**

Brenda had played a huge role this year to make things run smoothly at the office. Her diligent application of herself, sometimes under difficult circumstances, displays the love and glory of God.

As we contemplate the past year, we are deeply humbled by God's grace. We would like to make use of this opportunity to commit every success or good thing to God, and to God alone, so that only He will get the glory. Praise be to his Name - for ever and ever! Of course, humanly speaking, we have had some disappointments and failures as well. But God is not finished with us yet - so please be patient!

For 2003 year we are planning:

- A brand new, additional course for Prayer Leaders. For the past two years, we have had numerous requests for this, but we have only recently received clear direction from the Lord concerning the subjects to address. The topics under consideration are: Harp & Bowl, Prophetic Acts, Church & the Environment, Lordship, The foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Witnesses & Martyrdom, Spiritual Ranking, Mythology & Symbolism, 21 Laws Revisited, The practical Role of Intercessors in the Transformation of a Gateway City.
- Several PILTC's (Prayer & Intercession Leaders Training Course) on invitation from different communities.
- The completion of the CD and video series on Freemasonry, Sun Worship and the Queen of Heaven.
- The creation of an opportunity for the rest of South Africa to attend the PILTC course in March 2003. This is an experiment which could enable us to take the course beyond the borders of the Western Cape. During the first week in March 2003, we will be running the first half of the PILTC at Logos Church in Bellville. The rest of SA had been invited.

For this holiday season, we would like to submit a number of prayer requests to you regarding these initiatives:

1. Please pray that the new course would be birthed maturely, and not premature- or postmaturely. Also pray for the practical aspects, like the emergence of appropriate teachers on the various topics, and quality notes to be drawn up. Also pray for things like target dates, marketing, favour with intercessors and church leaders.
2. Please pray that the communities who had invited us for the PILTC, shall be blessed, encouraged and strengthened by what they receive at the courses.
3. The release of the first CD and video on Freemasonry had caused a major stir in the spiritual realm. Please pray that the truth of the video will penetrate the heart of the lie (which forms the basis of any stronghold), especially in the Church. The Church has the answers to the world's problems, but is rendered powerless when she believes a lie. Pray that Jesus will lift the veil from the

eyes of that sector of Church leadership which remains to be in covenant and loyal to this fraternity.

Also pray for the quick completion of the rest of the series. During the production of the first CD and video, we had experienced immense spiritual resistance. Please also pray for our protection: Physically, emotionally and spiritually. Also for our children, finances, possessions and reputations. We are still looking for an investor who would partner with us for the production of the rest of the series.

4. We are experiencing definite resistance against the making available of the PILTC to the rest of the RSA. Please pray that territorial deities will not be able to hold back or hinder students from the rest of SA from attending the course in Bellville. We are looking for sponsors who would enable us to advertise in national Christian magazines and newspapers.
