Prayer Letter September 2003

The Convocation is now less than 3 months away and the first associated prayer action starts next month.

There has been incredible opposition in the Spiritual Realm with Satan throwing everything at the arrangements, from miscommunication to physical attacks on committee members and their families. Please lift the committee up, before the Lord in prayer every day.

The "early bird" discount 10%, is only valid until 5 October - any registration deposits received by the office from 6 October will be required to pay the full fees.

ROBBEN ISLAND

In conjunction with Intercessors of Cape Town and Judea Harvest, the Cape Action Committee is planning a 40 DAY PRE- CONVOCATION PRAYER ACTION STARTING 20 OCTOBER ON ROBBEN ISLAND. 400 years of people being banished to the island, has resulted in much hatred and bitterness which gives Satan legal right to operate. As Robben Island guards the Gateway to Cape Town and the Southern Entrance to Africa, this gives Satan legal right to obstruct God's purposes in Africa.

We would like to ask the Intercessors of Cape Town, to join with us in a few people going to the Island - every day from 20 October to 28 November to pray Blessings instead of curses, Peace instead of violence, to PROCLAIM THE SOUTHERN GATEWAY OPEN TO THE KING OF GLORY.

The number of believers in Cape Town, who have welcomed Jesus into their hearts and homes is small compared to the total population by and large, He is not yet welcome in this City. We need to pray that He will be welcome in this entire City.

FINANCIAL RELEASES

Pray that funds will be released, so that potential delegates can come to the Convocation from all over Africa and surrounding Island States. Applications are coming in from all over the Continent, and many of the delegates have been requesting sponsorship. Please forward to the Convocation Office the name of the coordinators of the ministers fraternal in your area. Henry Kirby, the Convocation Administrator would like to speak to ministers groups all over Cape Town and surrounding towns.

Pray that the right delegates will come from all over Cape Town, South Africa and Africa to the Convocation. The people we need are those who have authority in the place of prayer.

41 Day Prayer Actions Cape Town 20 October to 29 November 2003

Invitation to a Planning Meeting on 13 October 2003,

Dear Intercessors,

The Lord showed Hennie Jacobs of Judea Harvest that there is a spiritual stronghold of Satan situated on Robben Island, guarding the gateway to Cape Town and the southern tip of the African continent. This stronghold is rooted in the bitterness that has existed on the Island over 4 centuries of people being banished or imprisoned there.

This stronghold of bitterness has to be broken down spiritually and replaced by an altar of worship to the Lord. Peace, blessing and prosperity need to be prayed out in place of the bitterness, and proclamations need to be prayed out proclaiming that the King of Glory is welcome on the Island, in Cape Town and in Africa. We need to bless the people living on the Island.

When we are dealing with spiritual strongholds, we need to send in intercessor teams for a 40 day prayer "treatment" before the final prayer event where the spiritual leaders are involved.

This needs to happen during a 40 day period when small groups of intercessors go out to the Island each day and pray there. On day 41 there will be a larger group going to the Island on Saturday the 29th of November, including leaders from other parts of Africa. This group will pray out the final breakdown of Satan's stronghold and the opening of the Gateway of the South to the Lord.

Intercessors visited the Island in 2001 and prayed out prayers of identificational repentance and this type of praying does not need to be repeated. The continued speaking out of bitterness by a few of the tour guides is still a problem.

The 40 day prayer period would start on Monday the 20th of October so as to make Saturday the 29th November day 41, and the All African Convocation at UWC would then start on the evening of Monday the 1st of December 2003.

Those intercessors who cannot actually go out to Robben Island during this 40 day period could assist greatly by prayer walking in the City Bowl of Cape Town, around the seats of Authority such as Parliament and on the surrounding mountains. Intercessors could also pray at the Rhodes Memorial, which is architecturally based on the seat of Satan at Pergumum. Rev 2:13

We would like different people to be involved on each of the 40 days. Those who can manage more than one day are welcome, but we realise that there is a cost involved.

A boat trip to Robben Island costs R150.00 if one is on the Island for the time of a standard tour and R300.00 if one's time is extended beyond that. Those taking part on the 29th November, who have registered for the Convocation will be paid for by the Convocation. There will be limited places available on the 29th November so it is important to let us know if you can come. We will know by the meeting of the 13th October if we can get a place where intercessors can stay overnight on the Island or not.
