**Subject: Todd Bentley's show**

Dear Saints

I am deeply disturbed by the reports I get concerning *God TV's* coverage of the so-called Florida revival, led by Todd Bentley. It is well known that Bentley co-operates with, and follows the instructions of an "angel," Emma, which sporadically appears to him.

Folk who have researched the true revivals of the past conclude almost unanimously that every great revival had eventually petered out after some time, due to "Holy Spirit" manifestations which invariably seem to start some time after the awakening of such revivals. These manifestations include typical "Toronto Blessing" phenomena: "Holy" laughter, barking like dogs, crowing like roosters, uncontrollable shaking, "drunkenness", gliding like serpents, etc.

I have seen documentations of these very phenomena taking place in occult practices.

It seems that strange spirits, masquerading as the Holy Spirit, infiltrate every true revival, and eventually focus all attention on their "manifestations" - and the true Holy Spirit simply withdraws. I am convinced that what started out as a true revival at Toronto, was also eventually hijacked by these spirits.

The difference with the "Florida revival" is that it seems to have never even started in the true Holy Spirit, but that the entire "revival," since its inception, revolves around these manifestations and "healings" taking place.

One could trace this kind of "revival" from the Airport (Vineyard) Church in Toronto, Canada, through the "Catch the Fire" phenomenon of the late nineties, through Rodney Howard Browne *et al*, to the current Todd Bentley phenomenon. Very little lasting godliness had resulted from any of these. Also note that the Vineyard Church had eventually distanced itself from the Airport Church, and that one of the Airport Church's pastors had repented of his deception a year or two ago.

The current phenomenon had started in Florida, on the East Coast of the USA, and had blown across the Atlantic to Brittain, from where it invaded Europe. It was almost inevitable that it would hit South Africa in time. Now it is here.

I am also deeply disturbed by the fact that church leaders don't seem to discern the spirit behind this phenomenon. I've heard reputable church leaders condoning it, and wishing that it would also hit their churches!

Unfortunately, history has shown that some pentecostal and charismatic pastoral offices welcome almost any fad which would fill the pews, and resultingly, church coffers.

In this light, let us say this once and for all:

IF STOCKED CHURCHES OR STADIUMS MEANT REVIVAL, THEN ANY MAJOR SPORTS EVENT WOULD ALSO MEAN REVIVAL!

I am currently researching the so-called Kundalini spirit - the demonic entity which underpins the Babylonian Mysteries, Alchemy, Buddhism, Hinduism, Freemasonry, Kabbalah and the New Age.

I have not finished my research, but have enough evidence available to strongly suspect that the Todd Bentley show is little more than a strong Kundalini presence. And every church who would allow it, would make a strong contribution to the rapid dissemination of this demonic spirit amongst the body of believers.
